#### A Journey of 35 Years

A journey began on April 1, 1986 that has spanned thirty-five years. On that Tuesday morning a thirty-three-year-old man started serving as director of missions for the Caldwell Baptist Association. The thought of spending half of my life in one position never crossed my mind that day. Three days later on April 4<sup>th</sup> I turned thirty-four years old. This year, I will celebrate Easter and my sixty-ninth birthday on the same day.

There have been many changes in my family over three and a half decades. My wife, Barbara, and I came to Caldwell County with two little boys, ages two and four. Two years later, our home was blessed with a baby girl. That baby girl is grown, married, the mother of two precious sons, and an educator like her Mom. Our little boys are now grown men with successful careers - one in architecture and the other in banking. In addition, God has blessed our family with a wonderful daughter-in-law, son-in-law, and two grandsons. However, during this same time period we have laid to rest other family members that we miss.

The world has changed during these decades as well. New typewriters were purchased for use at the Baptist Center not long after I came, which were replaced a few years later by computers. I remember the excitement in the Baptist Center with the addition of a new fax machine that is rarely used

by our staff today. The first mobile phone used by our family was in a large leather bag that took up a lot of space on the front seat of the car. Today like many of you, I carry an iPhone in my pocket that enables me to communicate in ways that were unimaginable thirty-five years ago. Computer technology has probably changed what we do more than anything else.

The opinion many people have of Christ and His Church has also changed during these years. I remember the days when churches and ministers were respected even by people who did not believe the Gospel message. Today, the world tolerates the church as long as we stay in our places of worship. However, when we take a stand on biblical principles that speak against certain values and lifestyles we are criticized for being narrow-minded and out-of-touch with a modern society. Unfortunately, this dissatisfaction with the church is evidenced in a poll released by Gallup on March 29, 2021 and reported by Baptist Press and other news agencies. The poll reveals that in the United States “church members are in the minority for the first time in at least eight decades, with just 47 percent identifying with a congregation.” “The number was 70 percent in 1999.”

The coming of our Lord for His Church is thirty-five years closer than it was when I began this journey with the Caldwell Baptist Association in 1986. None of us know when the Lord will return, but according to what is revealed in the Bible it must be soon. We need to be ready when Jesus comes back. The words found in John 14:1-6 gives hope and encouragement in this troubled world. Jesus left this world by way of the cross to prepare a new home for those who believe in Him as Lord and Savior. He said: “I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me” (14:6). This coming Sunday we will celebrate Easter, sharing the Good News that the tomb near Jerusalem where His body was laid is empty and Jesus is alive! Do you know Him as your Lord and Savior?

Thank you for your friendship and support during these many years. It is an honor and a blessing to serve as the Associational Mission Strategist (AMS) for the Caldwell Baptist Association. Yes, my title has also changed since 1986. Throughout these many years of ministry, you have been so kind and cooperative. I could not have asked for a better group of people with whom to share my life than with Caldwell Baptists.

In recent days, many of you have sent cards, made telephone calls, voiced kind comments, and shared gifts to celebrate my birthday and work anniversary. From the bottom of my heart, thank you for every expression of your love. Our journey moving forward will not be as long together as it has been, so in the days that do remain, let us be faithful servants of the King of kings and the Lord of lords.

The Convention has identified 250 Pockets of Lostness in North Carolina. A pocket of lostness is where a high concentration of unchurched and unsaved people live. Three of the pockets are located in Caldwell County. Would you be willing to pray for your neighbors?

Here's what you do: (1) Sign up to pray at [Pray Together](#). This link will take you to a simple form where you can register to participate in the prayer effort. Please indicate "Unifour" for the area when you register. Then (2), go pray. Walk or drive through your neighborhood, saturating your neighbors in prayer, particularly those who do not know Christ. It is a very simple activity, but one that could have eternal results. If you cross paths with one or more neighbors, then as the Holy Spirit leads you, talk with them about the Lord. Do this "Scattered Prayer Walk or Drive" activity when it is convenient for you. You may wish to walk with your spouse or another family member or friend. 
